



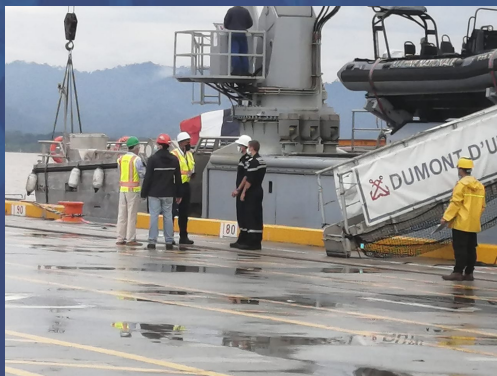

## The Government of France sent a French Navy Ship, loaded with 27,559 tons of humanitarian aid for Honduras

Through the Red Cross, the Government of France sent 27,559 tons of humanitarian aid to Honduras, these will contribute to rescue and support efforts for victims of storms Eta and Iota. The French navy ship left from the Isle of Guadalupe, with 35 tons of aid for Central America, (Guatemala and Honduras).

The French humanitarian assistance is valued in USD 105,844.00, and consists of 6,650 blankets, 216 Tents for families, 100 ropes, 400 kits of tools, 1,100 tarps, 3,000 drums, 500 kits of kitchen and 1,000 mats. The French Embassy reported that the decision was coordinated by the Crisis Management Center and Support from the Ministry for Europe, as well for Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of the Armed Forces of that country.

## Help from Canada arrives to the Sula Valley through the International Federation of the Red Cross

The government of Canada sent humanitarian aid to Honduras valued at close from USD 412,976.35 channeled through the International Federation of the Red Cross, to give regional response to the relief effort for the emergency caused by tropical storms Eta e Iota that late November flogged harshly the country, leaving heavy human and material losses. In the same way the government of Canada reprogrammed funds from PROLEMPA and PROMUCLIMA (per USD 69,203.7) projects.

Part of the help consists of materials for supplying drinking water: filters, water tanks and a laboratory for water treatment, as well as a basic clinic with the capacity to tend 50 patients per day, for a three month period. The humanitarian aid from Canada will benefit more than 55 thousand people in the northern area of the country, specifically in the Sula valley .



## South Korea donated half a million dollars through Red Cross and WFP

The Ambassador of the Republic of Korea in Honduras JaeHyunShim, signed with the Honduran Red Cross, an act of donation for USD 199,985.00 thousand dollars, as aid humanitarian aid to be used in the restoration of areas flooded and for the benefit of those affected by storms solidarity network. Since the passage of the Tropical ETA storm in Honduras, many countries have joined the cause to help our people, who are greatly grateful.

In the same way, he promised to make another donation for USD \$ 300,000 to be channeled through the Program World Food WFP, as support for the emergency in the regions affected by the natural phenomena. The total contribution of the Korean government amounts to USD 500 thousand dollars. The government of the Republic of Korea will also make another donation of 40,000 masks through UNICEF to strengthen bio-security efforts in areas affected by the storms to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
